Student Responsibilities

The Modesto City Schools Conduct Code will be in force during the summer sessions.

1. Attend school daily. Students who miss 7 hours of a summer school class will be dropped from the class. Students not attending the first day of classes (Monday, June 11th) will be dropped. There are no excused absences.
2. Protect the rights of others to study and learn.
3. Be on time for school. Being late for class will be counted as being absent for that hour(s) of attendance.
4. Complete all in-class and homework assignments and meet deadlines.
5. Respect school and personal property and carefully use and return all materials and equipment.
6. Come to class prepared to work.
7. Obey school rules. Rules are designed to allow a school to meet its obligation to educate students.
8. Possession or use of any controlled substance (drugs, including drug paraphernalia, alcohol) is forbidden on school grounds and may result in your immediate dismissal from summer school. Students who cause, or threaten to cause, physical injury to another person, possess/use weapon/dangerous objects, and/or defy the valid authority of supervisors, teachers, administrators, or other school officials, may be dropped immediately from the program.
9. Remain within the student areas designated for passing periods and breaks. Students found out of bounds may lose their privilege to attend summer school.
10. ALL summer school sites are closed campuses. Students may not leave campus at any time during class sessions.

Any violation of the above guidelines will result as follows; however, if the violation is a suspendable offense according to MCS Conduct Code, the student will be suspended and dropped from summer school.

Violation #1 – Student counseled by teacher.

Violation #2 – Student counseled by teacher and administration and parent contacted.

Violation #3 – Drop from summer school program.

Student Dress, Grooming, Appearance, Health & Safety Code

During summer school, the MCS dress code will be strictly enforced. Good taste and good grooming are a part of learning. Students are to dress in a manner that will permit participation in the academic activities offered at junior high summer school.

We do not want to discourage you from dressing comfortably. **However**, students wearing short-shorts, low-cut and see-through tops, halter tops, tube tops, bare midriffs, unhemmed cutoffs, half T-shirts, or maintaining any other student dress, grooming, appearance which disrupts, or tends to disrupt the educational process, will be sent home immediately to correct the problem. In addition, the District's NO HAT/headwear policy will be strictly enforced. Any dress that may be perceived as being gang-affiliated is **not acceptable – including the following:**

- Professional or college team jerseys and/or shirts
- Solid RED or BLUE shirts and/or canvas belts

Online courses may not meet some college entrance requirements and may not be accepted by the NCAA Clearinghouse for intercollegiate athletics
- ❖ I understand that no transportation will be provided.
- ❖ I have read and discussed with my student the Student Responsibility and Student Dress sections of this brochure.
- ❖ I understand and will support these guidelines.
- ❖ I understand that my student may be put on a waiting list depending upon space availability.
- ❖ I understand if my student misses the 1st day of Summer School (**Monday, June 11th**), or 7 hours in a class he/she will be dropped from summer school.
